What is a Community Health Worker?

Community Health Workers are certified by the Ohio Board of Nursing and are trained to be an integral member of the community health care delivery team. Community health workers can work as agents of change by providing a variety of services including; outreach to underserved and hard to reach populations, health promotion and health education, client tracking, needs assessment and the provision of follow-up services, client advocacy, and health care services. CHWs are trained to provide services integrating a cultural and linguistic sensitive approach.

What is the Community Health Worker Program at Chatfield College?

Chatfield College is currently one of only three Community Health Worker Training Programs approved by the Ohio Board of Nursing. The program is 2 semesters. The first semester is foundations of community health and health care and is offered two days per week. The program also includes 130 hours of practicum field experience, as required by the Ohio Board of Nursing. Each cohort is limited to 18 students. The classes provide a total of 13 Semester Credit hours toward the Associate of Arts degree at Chatfield.*

They include being 18 years of age, having a High School Diploma or equivalent, a Criminal Records Check and evidence of successful completion of an Approved Community Health Worker training Program. This is outlined in the Ohio Revised Code Chapter 4723.84 at <http://codes.ohio.gov/orc/4723.84>.

When should I enroll in the Community Health Worker program?

Space is limited to the first 18 students, so interested participants should enroll as soon as possible. In addition, early enrollment will help secure financial aid arrangements in a timely manner. Classes are offered during the fall and spring semesters. Only the clinical practicum is offered during the summer semester.

What else should I know about the Community Health Worker Program at Chatfield College?

How long is the program?

The program is two semesters (23-30 weeks).

Where are classes held?

Classes are held at Chatfield College at Findlay Market; 1800 Logan Street; Cincinnati, OH 45202.

How much does it cost?

Cost for the Community Health Worker program is calculated using Chatfield's current tuition rate for the 13 semester hours of college credit. There are additional fees for class and computer supplies, as well as the background check fees, certificate application fee and equipment, etc. for the clinical practicum. The only other costs will be a computer textbook and appropriate clothing for practicum.

Is financial aid available?

Absolutely! Eligible students may have a part of or all costs covered by grants, scholarships, or loans. Chatfield College will assist all interested students in determining their financial aid eligibility. Many students already employed may be eligible for employer tuition reimbursement.
